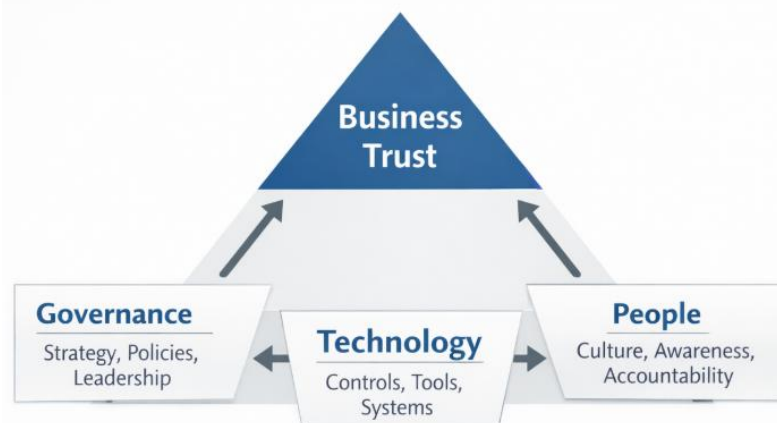
That's why information security has evolved beyond tools and technologies.
